1.00	EXPLAINING THE APPLICATION
1.01	The premises concerned is MPH Hotel Ltd, Northop Road, Flint Mountain, CH6 5QG. Its location can be seen in Appendix A.
1.02	The applicant is Mr Yan Chan
1.03	The application is for Variation of a Premises Licence for MPH Hotel Ltd, Northop Road, Flint Mountain, CH6 5QG.
1.04	The premises currently hold a Premises Licence for :-

1.06	A plan to identify the front outside area is show as Appendix B1 and a plan to identify the inside of the building is shown as Appendix B2.
1.07	A letter was received from Mrs Ann Williams from North Wales Police (NWP) on 11 <sup>th</sup> August 2020. The letter made no objection to the application, but asked for additional conditions in relation to CCTV, Challenge 25 and Door Supervisors. The applicant has agreed to these conditions being attached to the existing premises licence therefore NWP have confirmed they will not be attending the hearing. Please see Appendix C.
1.08	Representations to the variation application were received from Flintshire County Council's Pollution Control section on 24 <sup>th</sup> July 2020. These are shown at Appendix D.
1.09	North Wales Fire and Rescue Service have confirmed in writing that they will not be making any representations to the Licensing Authority regarding the application. See Appendix E.
1.10	Two Letters of representation from local residents were received in objection to the variation application. See Appendix F.
1.11	For variation applications, applicants are required to submit an operating schedule, detailing any additional steps they intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives, which are:

	<ul><li>The prevention of crime and disorder</li><li>Public safety</li></ul>
	<ul><li>The prevention of public nuisance</li><li>The protection of children from harm</li></ul>
	The steps that the applicant intends to take to promote the four licensing objectives are set out in Appendix G.
1.12	The application was advertised in the correct manner.
1.13	The applicant previously notified the licensing section of four Temporary Event Notices (TEN's) for the following dates and times.
	Notice 1 6th – 8th August 2020 – 12.00 – 22.00
	Notice 2 13th – 16th August 2020 – 12.00 – 22.00
	Notice 3 20th – 23rd August – 12.00 – 22.00
	The TEN's were to cover licensable activity in the outside area as indicated in Appendix B1.
1.14	Three of these Temporary Event Notices were considered at a Licensing Sub-committee hearing following objections made by Flintshire County Council's Pollution Control Officer.
1.15	The TEN's were approved after the applicants voluntary suggestion to amend the end time of each of the TEN's to 21.00 hours.
	The Chairman advised Mr. Chan (though not a condition of the approval) that the Sub Committee wished him to continue to manage and maintain the premises to ensure that there would be no disturbance to local residents due to loud music emanating from the site.
1.16	During the application period a marquee has been erected in the outside area being considered as part of this variation. It has been confirmed that there is no current planning permission for this structure.
1.17	In addition to this during the Coronavirus Pandemic the compliance team have had occasion to speak with the applicant on three separate occasions in relation to gatherings, social distancing and not following the Welsh Government guidance in relation to gazebo's and marquees.
1.18	When the applicant was asked to provide his risk assessment which is mandatory under the coronavirus regulations he failed to provide this.

7.00	GLOSSARY OF TERMS
7.01	Licensing Act 2003 – referred to as the Act.
	<b>Premises Licence</b> – means a licence granted under the Act, in respect of any premises, which authorises the premises to be used for one or more licensable activities.

**Licensable activities** – these are the sale by retail of alcohol, the supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or o the order of, a member of the club, the provision of regulated entertainment, and the provision of late night refreshment.


**Supply of alcohol** – means the sale by retail of alcohol, or the supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or to the order of, a member of the club.

**Licensing Objectives** - the Act sets out four licensing objectives. These are the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, prevention of public nuisance, and the protection of children from harm.


**Temporary Event Notice** - A Temporary Event Notice (TEN) is a standalone licensing permission which permits licensable activities for 499 people or less, for a short period of time. They can either temporarily extend or amend licensable activity in respect of a premises which already has a premises licence or club premises certificate, or can apply where there is no existing licensing permission in place.














I write with reference to the above application, which has been discussed with Inspector Gareth Cust, the officer responsible for this area.

North Wales Police make no objections to this application, however, it is requested that the following conditions be attached to the premises licence under the licensing objectives of Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Protection of Children from Harm:-

- A digital, colour hard disc CCTV system to be installed and maintained in a good working order. Recordings are to be kept for a minimum of 28 days and made available for inspection by Police or Local Authority, upon request.
- There must be a member of staff trained in the use of the CCTV system, with the knowledge and capability to download CCTV footage at the request of Police or Local Authority
- The premises will operate Challenge 25 policy
- SIA Door supervisors will be employed at the venue at the discretion of the Premises Licence Holder

Should the applicant be in agreement with the above representations, they or their representatives are requested to confirm this to the relevant Council Licensing Department as soon as possible. This MAY avoid the need for a hearing before Committee, dependent upon any other representations received from other responsible authorities or interested parties.





Mountain Park Hotel, Northop Road, Flint Application to Amend the Existing Licence to Allow Background Music to be Played Outside Hours of Operation Monday to Sunday 12.00 to 22.00

I object very strongly to the granting of this application on the grounds of noise pollution. We live in the bungalow next door and are currently in the process of completing a nuisance record form (Ref. DLJ207586) with regard to the unacceptable noise levels emanating from the Mountain Park Hotel. On top of the loud disco type music which in no way can be described as background music, we have a beer garden that includes at the loud of the loud

We were awoken on Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> August at 07.30 hrs by workmen erecting the steel skeleton for a very large marquee in the beer garden and this addition has made it possible to continue serving meals and drinks during periods of inclement weather. During the previous weekend from 31<sup>st</sup> July and 2<sup>nd</sup> August and 7<sup>th</sup> August to 9<sup>th</sup> August, both periods of hot and sunny weather, life and the noise levels have become intolerable and we had to leave home to gain relief. The overall situation is having a detrimental affect on our health by causing stress and anxiety to the extent that we can't see an end to our misery and that its getting worse as the venue gains more popularity and makes one fear what the future holds for my wife and myself.

Since this situation arose in mid July when restaurants and pubs were allowed to open outside, the noise has steadily increased and try as I have to put intolerable noise out of my mind, its been impossible to do so.

Last Tuesday I had a telephone consultation with the doctor regarding my inability to get a good nights sleep (I keep waking up fearing and worrying about the situation and how unfair and inconsiderate the whole issue is). The doctor prescribed 7 sleeping tables (Zopiclone) with a warning to only take one when absolutely necessary as they can become additive. I took one last Monday, but it had little effect and I'm still suffering from sleep deprivation.

As a matter of urgency, I request procedures to monitor the noise levels be actioned that will result in a visit by the environment planning and town counsellors would be welcomed.
